<b>Smoking Related</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Medical/ Personal Hygiene</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
Includes things like cigarette butts and cigars, as well as the packaging they come in. Lighters are included in this category too.		This includes anything things like toiletries, first aid supplies, diapers and feminine hygiene products, or anything associated with medicine.	
<b>Food Related</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Dumping</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
Anything that can hold food or helps people eat food should be included here. For example: candy wrappers, chip bags, straws, forks and spoons, cups, bottles, cans, and take out containers.		This is for items that look like the they're from an industrial or construction site but were thrown away improperly. For example: aerosol cans, construction materials, large packing materials, tires, batteries, and electronics.	
<b>Fragments</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Other</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
These are pieces that have broken off of larger pieces of trash. If the item is small and you can't tell where it came from, include it here.		This is for anything that doesn't fit into the other categories.	
<b>Waterway Activities</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>		
Includes things like fishing supplies, rope, and flotation devices.

<b>Plastic</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Biodegradable</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
This should include anything that is mostly made of plastic. For example, plastic bags, Styrofoam cups, cigarette butts, food wrappers, pens, and single-use containers		This includes items that can break down naturally in the environment, such as food waste, paper, cardboard, and yard waste.	
<b>Fabric and Cloth</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Biohazard</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
Includes both synthetic and natural materials. Can be clothing, from things like tents, or pieces of fabric.		Includes items that can be harmful to living things because of chemicals or bacteria. For example feminine hygiene products, diapers, dead animals, medical waste, or pet waste.	
<b>Large</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Metal</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
These can be made of many materials, but are simply large in size. For example, furniture, shopping carts, tires, and appliances.		Includes anything made mostly of metal. For example, aluminum cans, sheet metal, nails, batteries, and wire.	
<b>Glass</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>	<b>Miscellaneous</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>
Includes things like glass bottles or pieces of glass.		This is for anything that doesn't fit into the other categories.	
<b>Construction</b>	<b>Number of Items</b>		
Includes items used for construction and building like concrete, bricks, and wood (not natural sticks).
